

Since 1985, Alette de Jong has been involved in burn care at the Burn Centre of the Red Cross Hospital in Beverwijk, the Netherlands, as registered nurse and as nurse researcher. She studied nursing science at the University of Wales in Cardiff, United Kingdom, and obtained her PhD degree in 2013. Working for both the Burn Centre and the Association of Dutch Burn Centres, she initiates, performs and coordinates research in the field of burn nursing to improve the quality of nursing care.

Implementation of research results in nursing practice, performing publications and presentations, and teaching at the Dutch burn nursing course are part of her responsibilities. Her research topics focus on pain measurement, pain management and comfort increasing interventions. Among other things, she actively participates in the Nursing Committee and the Research Committee of the International Society for Burn Injuries, is board member of the European Burns Association, is editor in chief of the burn care manual of the Dutch Burns Foundation, editorial board member of Burns Open, and is member of the Nursing Honor Society Sigma Theta Tau International.
